As we are aware that "APCON 20201" was successfully conducted virtually by Chhattisgarh chapter, which was held at Raipur. Before we say good-bye to year 2021; I'm summarising academic activities of various state chapters of IAPM which were conducted in last quarter (Oct, Nov & Dec'21) of the year:

Karnataka Chapter: KCIAPM organized KAPCON 2021 Virtual Conference from 1- 3 October, 2021 under the Dr Usha Kini, President, and Dr Vijayshankar, Hon Secretary, along with Dr Aditya Agnihotri as the Organizing Secretary. Twelve Sessions on various subspecialities were organized with 36 National and International faculty

Dr K Ramnarayan, delivered Dr M R Parthasarthy and Dr A V Ramaprasad Oration on the topic "The Pathologist as a teacher". 300 Oral Paper and 440 E-Poster were presented. 10 Virtual Pre-Conference Workshops with Subject experts from across the country were conducted for over 300 delegates. Innovative competitions link PathKalakar, PathMeme, PathReels, PathArt, Pathblogs were conducted.Dr Nandakishore Alva, elected as new President of KCIAPM, Dr Suresh Hanagavadi, Vice-President, Dr Aditya Agnihotri as Hon. Secretary&Dr Thejasvi Krishnamurthy continuing as Treasurer of KCIAPM.

Odisha Chapter: The 49th Annual meet of IAPM, Odisha chapter was held in virtual mode on 14th November 2021, "Odisha APCON Virtual - 2021". organised by VSS Institute of Medical Science and Research (VIMSAR), Burla, Odisha, jointly with IAPM HQ and Odisha chapter. Chettinadu hospital and Research institute conducted a national CME (online) on 18.12.2021 titled "CHETPATHCON 2021 - "Lymphoproliferativediseases An Overview and Update". Around 120 delegates attended it. Speakers included Dr Muthalagu Ramanathan, Dr Sarala Ravindran &Dr Rakee Kar. An online academic activity conductedby Zone 5 (Thirunelveli, Madurai, Theni, and nearby places) on 23 Dec'21. Dr Swaminathan

MINUTES OF GB MEETING (ONLINE) HELD ON 01.12.2021 AT 05:30PM

General body Meeting of IAPM was held online on 01.12.2021 at 05.30pm. Sixty seven members attended the meeting. Prof. Vatsala Misra, President IAPM presided over the meeting and welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Agenda No.1-Condolence to the departed souls of IAPM members: In the beginning, all members were informed about sad demise of members of IAPM; Dr. Arun R. Chitale, Dr. Raj Mehrotra, Dr. Subir Datta, Dr. (Col) S. Satyanarayana, Dr. B.K. Mohapatra, Dr. Vijay Bhaskar, Dr. S.D.Patil, Dr. Zarin Bharucha and Dr. Nikhil Moorchung.

Resolution: Agenda No. 01/2021: GB observed 02 minutes silence in the memory of departed souls. Secretary expressed that condolence letters had been sent to their family members except Dr. Zareen Bharucha which will be sent soon..

Agenda No.2: Apologies by EC members about their not availability:

Resolution: Agenda No. 02/2021: Dr. Harsh Mohan and Dr.(Col) D.K. Mishra had sent message expressing their apology for not being able to attend the GB meeting.

Agenda No.3: Confirmation of minutes of last GBMs

Resolution: Agenda No. 03/2021: Minutes of 68th GBM at APCON 2019, Chandigarh was approved in online meeting held on 16.08.20 & minutes of online EC meeting held on 02.05.21 was approved by GB on 11.07.21.

Agenda No. 4: Report of Honorary Secretary, IAPM:

Resolution: Agenda No. 04/2021: GB accepted the report of Secretary, IAPM and appreciated the effort of Secretary for wide display of IAPM in several digital platforms like facebook, telegram and YouTube: as well as Secretary's sincere efforts in conducting online teaching sessions (IAPM webinars). Since year 2020 was declared a null year, President Dr. Vatsala misra & Vice President Dr. Kim Vaiphei continued in same posts for 2 years i.e. 2020 & 2021.

Agenda No. 5: Report of Joint Secretary, IAPM:

Resolution: Agenda No. 05/2021: The GB accepted the report of Joint Secretary IAPM. But expressed concern over inactivity of many chapters barring a few. The state chapter chairpersons were requested to make their chapters active & perform various academic & social activities & send report to Jt. Secretary in time. Regarding North west chapter joint secretary of IAPM was authorised to initiate the process of revival. It was decided to call a meeting of Prof Harsh Mohan, Prof Bishan Radotra and Prof Ashim Das at the earliest to solve the issue.

Agenda No. 6: Report of Treasurer, IAPM:

Resolution: Agenda No. 06/2021: GB accepted report of Treasurer IAPM. Members expressed concern over continuation of very old awards / orations of IAPM after so many years instituted in names of Dr. Anantnarayan, Dr. Usha Hardas & Kidwai institute etc. & it was decided to take a decision after asking their family members whether to stop/continue them & whether to increase the prize money. Regarding continuation of Tamilnadu Puducherry Chapter Oration Secretary, IAPM was asked to consult chapter chairperson Dr. Sandhya Sundaram.

Financial year of 2020-2021 has ended with surplus balance of rupees 17,60,266.95/-. In order to utilise these funds judiciously, IAPM has proposed to increase the prize money given for various papers, posters and quizzes & also

by providing travel grant to postgraduate students.

DCB bank savings account needs to be closed as it is reflected in annual information statement of IAPM and interest generated (2,18,058/-) will be considered as IAPM income. In this issue, it was decided to urgently contact Dr. Dilip Ramrakhiani for closure of Jaipur conference Account, 2016 and to write a letter why IAPM is paying IT for interest incurred by APCON 2016 account.

Agenda No. 7: Report of Editor, Indian Journal of Pathology & Microbiology:

Resolution: Agenda No. 07/2021: GB approved report of Editor & appreciated effort of Editorin-Chief for maintaining high standard of journal. Proposal for two Assistant Editors(social media) were accepted. IAPM best paper award was given to the paper "Impact of ERCC1 gene polymorphisms on response to cisplatin based therapy in oral squamous cell carcinoma (OSCC) patients." published in Oct-Dec 2020 IJPM issue by ML AvinashTejasvi, G Maragathavalli, Uday Kumar Putcha, M Ramakrishna, Vijayaraghavan, CK Anulekha Avinash, From Department of Prosthodontics, Kamineni Institute of Dental Sciences, Narketpally, Nalgond, Telangana.

Two special issues were released: Genitourinary, gynecological & breast pathology in 2020 & Gastrointestinal, hepatobiliary & pancreatic pathology in 2021.

Agenda No. 8: Joint Secretary, IAPM HQ: Resolution: Agenda No. 08/2021: GB approved report of Joint Secretary, IAPM HQ along with the Annual Budget Proposal. Extra budget of one lakh for purchase of a laptop was not approved by EC members. It was suggested that Joint Secretary, HQ will store all the records of IAPM in HQ.

Agenda No. 9: Report of Secretary, ICP: Resolution: Agenda No. 09/2021:Hon. Secretary, ICP expressed that the 26th AIPNA ICP CME was held online at Amrita Institute of Medical Sciences Kochi from 4-6th Feb 2021 with Dr Ajit Nambiar as the Organizing Chairperson and Dr Seethalakshmi NV, the Organizing Secretary Executive council election was held & the new council executives were elected unopposed which consists of Prof Francisco Couto as Dean, Col Prof D K Mishra as Associate Dean, Prof Usha Kini as Secretary, Dr J Thanka as Joint Secretary and Prof Ritambhra Nada as Treasurer. Dr N Jayaram, Dr Sharda Rane, Dr Sandhya Sundaram, Dr. Ranjan Agarwal and Dr Manoj Jain were nominated as Executive Council Members. GB approved report of Hon. Secretary, ICP

Agenda No. 10: Admission of new members to IAPM:

Resolution: Agenda No. 10/2021: Total members admitted to IAPM are 124 in 2021 & 39 in 2020. GB approved the new members of IAPM. Members expressed concern over admission of less number of members to IAPM. Though it could be due to the CoVid pandemic mostly, it was decided to create membership drive through chapter chairpersons & HODs of Pathology in different medical colleges.

Agenda No. 11: APCON 2022 & scientific program:

Resolution: Agenda No. 11/2021: GB accepted the proposal for APCON 2022 to be conducted by Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore from 30th Nov to 4th December 2022 with Dr. N.K.Alva as Organizing secretary. Scientific program will be decided later by the academic committee.

Agenda No. 12: Election for 2022: Nominations were received for posts of the President, Vice President and Editor-in-Chief (Elect)

a: Declaration of results for the post of President

2022: There were 2 valid nominations for the post of President- Dr. Dilip Ramrakhiani, Professor, Pathology, SMS Medical College, Jaipur, Rajasthan & Dr. Kim Vaiphei, Professor, Histopathology, PGIMER, Chandigarh. Electronic voting was held this year also from 28th to 31st October with prior information to all members in website & personal mails. Mails were sent to 2032 members but voting was done by 513 only. It was observed by webmaster that many members are not opening their mail box which might be resulting in low voting. After election, Dr. Dilip Ramrakhiani got 183/464 votes (39.44%) & Dr. Kim Vaiphei received 281/464 votes (60.56%).

Resolution: Agenda No.12a/2021: The General Body accepted the election of Dr Kim Vaiphei to the post of President, IAPM for the year 2022. b: Declaration of results for the post of Vice-President 2022: There were 2 valid nominations for the post of Vice- President- Dr. Kanaklata Dei, Retd. Prof. & HOD, Pathology, MKCG MCH, Brahmapur, Odisha & Dr. Sharada Rane, Prof. & Head, Pathology & Deputy Dean, Govt. Medical College, Baramati, Pune Dr. Kanaklata Dei got 184/501 votes (36.72%) & Dr. Sharada Rane received 307/501 votes (63.28%).

Resolution: Agenda No.12b/2021: The General Body accepted the election of Dr Sharada Rane to the post of Vice-President, IAPM for the year 2022.

Declaration of results for the post of Editor-in-Chief (Elect) 2023-27: Two valid nominations were received of Dr Amanjit Bal, Professor, Histopathology, PGIMER, Chandigarh & Dr. Bharat Rekhi, Professor, Pathology, TMC, Mumbai, Dr. Amanjit bal got 210/474 votes (44.31%) & Dr. Bharat Rekhi got 264/474 votes (55.69%).

Resoluon: Agenda No.12c/2021: The General

Body accepted the election of Dr Bharat Rekhi to the post of Editor-in-Chief (Elect). Soumya Ranjan Sahoo, the web manager was thanked & congratulated for smooth conduct of voting electronically.

Agenda No. 13: Declaration of award papers for 2021 & 2020:

a) Dr.V.R. Kahanolkar award

There were 3 entries for this award for 2021which were sent to judges. Out of them, paper of Dr. Akash P. Sali for his paper "A Modified Histopathologic Staging in Penile squamous cell carcinoma predicts nodal metastasis and outcome better than the current AJCC Staging, Am J Surg Pathol 2020;44:1112–1117" was recommended by the judges.

For year 2020, there was no paper for this prize. **Resolution: Agenda No. 13a/2021:** The paper of Dr. Akash P. Sali was approved for Dr. VR Khanolkar award 2021 & no award for 2020.

b: Smt.Kunti Devi Mehrotra Award: There was one entry for this award which was sent to judges. After evaluation, it was found unsuitable for award.

For the year 2020, there was no paper for this award.

Resolution: Agenda No. 13b/2021: No awards were given for Smt. Kunti Devi Mehrotra award for the years 2021 & 2020.

c: Prof. KC Basu Mallick award and the Best paper Award: For 2021 there were 2 entries for Prof. K.C.Basu Mallick award which were selected for presentation after evaluation. After presentation, paper of Dr. Ridhi Sood, PGIMER, Chandigarh "Transcription factor immunohistochemistry in the classification of pituitary adenomas: proposal in limited resource setting" was selected by judges for this award. For 2020, there was only one entry for this award, which was found unsuitable for presentation after evaluation by judges.

Among entries for best paper award: in 2021 there was only one entry of Dr. Shruti NR, AIIMS, Bhubaneswar which was selected for presentation and after presentation paper of Dr. Shruti NR

"Cholesterol transporters in Glioblastomas: A clinicopathological study" was judged suitable for award. In 2020, out of 4 papers received for best paper award 3 were selected and only two were presented. After presentation, paper of Dr. Akruti Mishra, S.C.B. Medical College, Cuttack-"Study of association of Serous Tubal Intraepithelial Carcinoma in various gynaecological malignancies and its role in pelvic serous carcinogenesis" was selected for award.

Resolution: Agenda No. 13c/2021: Paper of Dr. Ridhi Sood was approved for Prof. K.C.Basu Mallick award for 2021 & no award in this category for 2020.

For best paper award, papers of Dr. Shruti NR & Dr. Akruti Mishra were approved for 2021 & 2020 respectively.

Agenda No. 14: Proposal for CMEs, Symposium & Oration an APCON 2022:

Resolution: Agenda No. 14/2021: Deadline for the above proposal was kept as 15th January 2021. Proposal by Dr. Ranjan Agrawal only was received by Secretary. Hence it was suggested that academic committee will finalize the topics for APCON 2022 later after discussion.

Agenda No. 15: Proposed venue for APCON 2023 ,2024 & 2025:

Resolution: Agenda No. 15/2021: GB accepted the proposal for venue as follows: 2023-AIIMS New Delhi, 2024-Cuttack, Odisha. Symbiosis MCH, Pune had sent a request letter to host APCON for the year 2025 but this was postponed to be discussed in next APCON.

Agenda No. 16: Dr. K. S. Ratnakar award Resolution: Agenda No. 16/2021: It was decided to rename Best paper award of IAPM into Dr. K. S. Ratnakar Best Paper award with a contribution Rs 5 lakhs as FD by his family members, which was approved by GB. After the payment of endowment money, MOU will be prepared & signed by his two daughters. The award will be instituted from next year.

- b) Regarding formation of new Tripura chapter: It was discussed by members & was decided that Joint secretary will examine the credibility of formation of a new chapter in name of Tripura chapter with existing North East chapter at present. He'll share the details after discussion with Tripura members to decide further course of action.
- c) Request letter from Dr. Deep Sikha Arora for instituting RCPath@Apollo award from IAPM with a donation of 10-20 lakhs: It was decided to ask her for a formal letter stating details of funding & award to be instituted. Secretary was asked to send her a mail regarding this.
- d) Proposal by Dr. (Col) D.K.Mishra: Dr. Mishra has given proposal to rename the Hematology session in APCON as IAPM-ISLH joint CME/symposium which will be more popular and give more visibility to the program. GB asked

for a request letter by members of ISLH following which it can be initiated.

Dr. Sidhartha Datta Gupta: Proposal for the "2nd Jt IAPM-ISG guidelines" on interpretation & reporting of IBD :It was approved by GB.



Sometimes things happen in life which you aren't prepared for. The 3rd of May 2021 was one such day when we lost our beloved Dr. (Col).Nikhil Moorchung to Covid.

Dr.(Col) Nikhil Moorchung- Born In New Delhi on the 31st of March 1969, completed his MBBS and MD (Pathology) from Armed Forces Medical College, Pune and DNB in 2000. He was conferredPhD in 2007 (Molecular Biology) from King George Medical University, Lucknow and went on to acquire Fellowship of the Indian College of Pathologists- 2013

and International Fellowship of the Indian Council of Medical Research in 2014.He was a Member of the National Academy of Medical Sciences. With a rich experience of being associated with the Indian army for over a decade he had served as medical officer in Ladakh, Kashmir and Punjab under extreme conditions.He was the Recipient of Dr K C BasuMallick Award 2006 and won National Awards for Best Research Papersfor over 3 times under the IAPM.With over 60 original articles published in reputed national and international journals he authored a book 'Molecular Medicine Demystified'. He had served several academic posts including thecadre of HOD- Pathology at AFMC Pune and had worked as Senior Consultant - Surgical Pathology and Molecular Diagnostics in Anand Diagnostic Laboratory Bengaluru, had designed his own primers and standardised several molecular diagnostic tests.

An avid reader and an excellent writer, his middles were published regularly in Deccan Herald and Bangalore Mirror. He led a simple life with limited needs and was ever approachable when needed. Sir is survived by his wife Mrs.MamtaMoorchungand sons Udbhav and Siddharth.

My interaction with Sir was when he joined us as Head of Department in an upcoming Medical Institute during the latter half of 2020. Though with us for a few months, he has created memories for many of us to last for a lifetime
