Joint Secretary's Report

West Bengal: The 31st APMWB Annual State Conference and Dr. R.N. Ghosh Memorial CME was organised by The Dept. of Pathology, Gouridevi Institute of Medical Sciences and Hospital, Durgapur, West Bengal on 21st and 22nd September, 2024. Prof. Dr Kanak Lata Devi, honourable President IAPM delivered the Dr. SN De Memorial Oration. Prof. Dr. Ranu Sarkar, Chairperson, APMWB and Prof. Dr. Ranu Roy Biswas, secretary, APMWB guided the Organizing Chairperson, Prof. Dr Pradip Kumar Mitra, and Organising Secretary Prof Dr Subodh Kumar Bhattacharya. The topic of Dr. R. N. Ghosh memorial CME was Neoplastic lesions of lung. Eminent speakers included Prof. Dr. Amanjit Bal (PGIMER Chandigarh), Dr Bidyut Krishna Goswami (NBMC). Prof. Dr Mrinal Kanti Ghosh (BMC) and Dr. Divya Midha (TMC Kolkata). Postgraduate trainees presented oral papers and around 100 poster presentations. Eminent pathologist Prof Dr Kalyani Mitra and Prof Dr Saraswati Majumder were felicitated during the conference.



Maharashtra: Department of Pathology of Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Sawangi Wardha and Datta Meghe Medical College Nagpur, Constituent units of DMIHER Wardha organized this prestigious 45th Annual Conference of Association of Pathologists (Maharashtra Chapter – IAPM) at Datta Meghe Medical College Nagpur from 27th to 29th of September 2024. In Pre-conference events, two CMEs and one seminar were organised. One of the CME was titled ‘Micro Insights: Navigating the Landscape of Small Biopsy in Pathology’ and other CME was titled ‘Current Trends and Haematological insights. The Conference was inaugurated by Dr. Vedprakash Mishra, Dr. Aruna Vanikar and Dr Shubhangi Agale. The highlights of the conference were MAPCON Slide Seminar and MAPCON PG quiz. The conference was attended by more than 600 delegates & 30 speakers. 225 paper/ posters were presented by postgraduates which included prestigious ‘Raichur award for oral paper presentations.



Uttar Pradesh: UP PATHCON 2024, 31st Annual Conference of U.P. Chapter of IAPM was organized by the Dept of Pathology, Subharti Medical College, Meerut. The conference was attended by 484 delegates of which 255 delegates presented scientific oral paper /poster presentations. There were academic sessions comprised of guest lectures by eminent speakers & interesting case presentations by young faculty members. Prestigious Dr Lahiri oration was delivered by Dr. Vatsala Misra, Principal, MLNMC, Prayagraj. Uttar Pradesh Medical Council awarded 6 credit hours for the conference. Dr. Anjali Khare, organizing chairperson and Dr. Shubhangi Gupta organizing secretary were declared as President and Executive member of UP Chapter of IAPM respectively for coming year. Dr Ranjan Agrawal conducted an engaging PG Quiz.



Department of Pathology, Regency Hospital, Kanpur organised its third consecutive CME “ONCOPATHOLOGY UPDATE 2024” on 3rd and 4th Aug 24. There were three live slide discussion sessions, on Breast Oncopathology, Male Genitourinary Oncopathology and Haematolymphoid malignancies. More than 150 pathologists attended and the guest faculty included Dr. Anita Borges, Dr. Nuzhat Husain, Dr. Sumeet Gujral, Dr. Asawari Patil, Dr. Santosh Menon.

An Inter-College PATHART Competition was organized by Department of Pathology, K.D. Medical College, Mathura for MBBS Students. All the participants were encouraged to interpret this year’s theme “Patient Under Microscope” in their own unique way and submit handmade painting depicting the same. Judges included invited Chief Guest - Dr. Harendra Kumar (National Treasurer, IAPM) and Prof. Dr. R.K Ashoka (Dean/Principal). The best three outstanding paintings were awarded prizes. The Organizing Chairperson was Prof. Dr. Praneeta J. Singh, and Organizing secretaries Dr. Sangeeta Singh and Dr. Ambrish Kumar.

Andhra Pradesh: The department of pathology Narayana Medical College, Nellore organised 6th state conference from 14th to 16th September 2024. 500 delegates attended this conference. Key note address was by Dr. Roberto Salgado, Anatomic Pathologist, Antwerp, Belgium and gave his talk on Tumor Infiltrating Lymphocytes in breast carcinoma and also conducted hands on workshop on 16th September. Dr Nalini Bansal Director IGHP Gurgaon delivered an oration on Role of Artificial Intelligence in Pathology followed by Dr Ranjini who spoke on Cancer cervix screening by AI. Symposium on Precision Oncology was conducted the next day. The speakers included Dr K Durga, Dr Sudha Muthy, Dr Shankari. A souvenir was released by Dr Srinivasulu Reddy. Narayana Medical college secured 2 gold medal awards, one young scientist award and first prize for proffered paper session.



Minutes of 3rd Mid Year General Body Meeting held on 31st August 2024 (ONLINE mode over Zoom platform)

An ONLINE (Virtual) mode meeting was held over Zoom platform mainly to finalise various aspects of importance especially related to sanction of IAPM finances. The meeting started at 6 PM. Since the quorum was not complete, so the meeting was postponed and reconvened after 10 minutes. The following senior members and Past Presidents expressed their inability to attend the meeting - Dr Vatsala Misra, Dr Siddhartha Datta Gupta and, Dr Pradeep Vaideeswar.

The following members attended the meeting - Dr Kanaklata Dei (President), Dr Asaranti Kar (Vice- President), Dr Ranjan Agrawal (Secretary), Dr Harendra Kumar (Treasurer), Dr Varsha Dhume (Jt Secretary), Dr Biswjit Dey, Dr Pranati Mohanty (Jt Secretary HQ), Dr Mangala Nagare, Dr Deepak Kumar Mishra, Dr Pallav Gupta, Dr. G.N. Mohanty, Dr NC Parija, Dr Dhaneswar Lanjewar, Dr Vandana, Dr Yookarin Khonglah, Dr Ridhima Goyal, Dr Anamma, Dr Chitra Madiwale, Dr Asitava Mondal, Dr Gayatri Gogoi, Dr Sharada Rane, Dr AM Phatak.

1. IAPM Platinum Jubilee Documentary: As decided in the EC the following IAPM members would prepare the Platinum Jubilee documentary - Dr AM Phatak (Chairperson), Dr. DN Lanjewar, Dr GN Mohanty and Dr Varsha Dhume. The committee displayed various quotations procured from different service providers. The proposal by Mr Abhishek Gunaji was shortlisted for the documentary. After much deliberations it was decided that considering the attention span of delegates, the total duration of the documentary should be approximately 9-10 minutes and it would be played during the APCON 2024 inaugural ceremony on 12 December 2024. The total amount allotted and sanctioned by IAPM for this documentary including a Coffee Table Book was 5 Lacs as decided in the EC (Proposed by Dr DK Mishra and seconded by Dr NC Parija).

2. IAPM Platinum Jubilee Brooch: It was decided in the EC and GBM that to commemorate IAPM Platinum Jubilee this year, a brooch bearing the IAPM logo and establishment year would be distributed EXCLUSIVELY to the registered delegates of APCON 2024. It was also felt that since Cuttack is famous for its filigree work, brooch made of filigree should be prepared. However, filigree brooch was costing around ₹ 1100/- per piece. As decided in the EC a total amount of ₹ 4.5 lacs was sanctioned by IAPM. Since 1000 delegates are expected to attend APCON 2024, so per piece cost including packaging, transportation etc. would be ₹ 450/-. This had been proposed by Dr DK Mishra and seconded by Dr GN Mohanty. Dr Asaranti has been entrusted the task of enquiring about other options and revert back with the designs and the final bulk cost after negotiating the price with the manufacturers.

3. IAPM UG Quiz: Dr Vaishali Walke, Professor & Head, Pathology at AIIMS, Bhopal shared the SOP of conducting the UG quiz is scheduled to start in the month of September 2024. Since the first step would start from the respective Chapters, so it was suggested that Jt Secretary IAPM would coordinate with the State Chapters and Dr Vaishali Walke in this regard (Proposed by Dr N Lanjewar and seconded by Dr DK Mishra). SOP for the Quiz mentioned dividing the Chapters and States into regions. Dr Ranjan divided the various States and Chapters into different regions as per the following distribution.

S.No		Region /States

4. IAPM Headquarter Matters: Various matters related to the IAPM Headquarter building at Cuttack were discussed extensively.

(a) Dr. Pranati Mohanty (Jt Secretary HQ) stated that the Headquarter building being old required regular maintenance and painting. Since, the painting and repair work was still going on in the Headquarter building as per the previous sanctioned budget Dr Pranati asked for an additional ₹ 441,828 towards the remaining work. After discussion this amount was sanctioned.

(b) Estimates and budgets for last 3 years were presented by Dr Pranati Mohanty. Discrepancies in the various entries of the Trial balance sheets were pointed out by the Treasurer as well as other Senior Members. Furthermore, it was observed that from the previous years some funds were still remaining in the Headquarter Accounts. It was suggested that on 31 March of every year, all remaining unused sanctioned funds should be returned back to IAPM and for payments towards routine expenses of the Headquarter an advance amount may be sanctioned and released by the Treasurer IAPM and regularized after proper scrutiny of the bills and expenses.

(c) It was unanimously decided that Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer would be members of the IAPM Headquarter Advisory Committee and would be invited to all the headquarter meetings (Physical or Virtual – ONLINE mode as suitable). Proposed by Dr. DN Lanjewar and seconded by Dr. DK Mishra.

5. Matters shared by Treasurer IAPM:

(a) Discrepancies in IAPM Registration and PAN Card:

The IAPM PAN Card bears the name “Indian Association of Pathologists and Microbiologists, while the Registration Certificate at Cuttack bears the name as “Indian Association of Pathologist and Microbiologist”. This discrepancy of missing alphabet ‘s’ in the Registration Certificate was pointed out by the Branch Manager of Axis Bank at Cuttack, where an IAPM Account exists, but has been marked as dormant due to this discrepant nomenclature. This matter was brought to the notice of the House by Dr. Harendra Kumar (Treasurer IAPM), that there was a difference in the name of IAPM in the Registration Certificate of IAPM at Cuttack and the IAPM PAN Card. However, Dr Ranjan Agrawal displayed the IAPM Registration Certificate sent by Dr DN Lanjewar registered in Mumbai in Hindi under the name of “Indian Association of Pathologists and Microbiologists.” Dr Harendra informed the House that on the basis of this, he will again pursue the matter with the Axis Bank Manager at Cuttack for restarting and revamping the dormant Account.

(b) Dr Harendra informed the House that under the IAPM clause of donating 10% of the APCON Registration fee to the parent body, APCON 2023 conducted by AIIMS, New Delhi donated ₹12,000,047.20 (Twelve lacs forty seven rupees and twenty paise only). The House appreciated this and thanked the Organisers of APCON 2023.

(c) All Applications valid for PG Travel Grant for the year 2023 were scrutinised by Secretary IAPM Dr Ranjan Agrawal and then submitted to the Treasurer IAPM. Dr Harendra informed the House that he has cleared all the payments.

(d) All pending bills of 2021 and 2022 whose details were submitted to the Secretary and Treasurer have been cleared. The House appreciated the Treasurer for his sincerity and timely clearance of bills.

Points raised by Secretary IAPM

Dr Ranjan Agrawal informed the House about his visit to the venue of APCON 2024 (Cuttack). Infrastructure wise it was satisfactory. However, there were 2 main concerns pointed out –

1. Accommodation in Cuttack. Accommodation could be an issue during APCON 2024 as there were limited numbers of decent hotels in Cuttack. Dr Asaranti Kar replied that if the delegates opt for accommodation in Bhubaneswar, a shuttle

service would be arranged by the organisers. This however would be free of charge to the delegates, but would be arranged plying in a fixed route with the vehicles adhering to the time and place.

2. Secondly, Dr Asaranti Kar, the Organising Secretary has been posted out of Cuttack so managing the event could be an issue. However, Dr Asaranti assured the House that she is putting all her efforts towards making the event a grand and memorable one. Also, Dr Lity Mohanty, the Organising Chairperson was stationed in Cuttack itself to look for all arrangements.

Other matter scheduled in the presentation but deferred due to non- discussion:

Since, the EC meeting continued for a long duration (3.5 Hours) some points were left out, to be discussed and so could not be carried forward to the GBM for ratification. These are being recorded here for future reference and final approval -

1. Two Lawyers [One from Bareilly, (Session court lawyer Mr. Manish Goel) and Mr Pankaj Saxena- Allahabad High Court Advocate from Prayagraj] were consulted for legal opinion related to the pending financial matter of APCON 2016. Their opinions received by Dr Ranjan Agrawal were shared with Dr Harendra Kumar and Dr DK Mishra (Chairman, enquiry Committee). Some further modifications have been suggested and would be referred to the IAPM Disciplinary Committee. For both consultations a total estimate bill of approx ₹ 15,000 was received. This amount thus remained pending for sanction.

2. IAPM Directory needs to be updated. Dr Ranjan Agrawal suggested that the last directory in a soft copy form was released in 2019 by Dr Sharda Rane and which had few corrections and errors as per the emails received and when compared with the 2005-06 printed copy. These errors were rectified in the website but not in the print version. Dr Ranjan Agrawal informed the House that he plans to get mainly soft copy and nearly 100 hard copies (Printed) for the IAPM office bearers, State chapter representatives and few copies for the IAPM Headquarter. An estimate of ₹ 50,000/- was suggested by Dr Ranjan Agrawal including sorting out of all discrepancies, typing, designing and printing of these 100 copies. However, Dr Lanjewar pointed out that this comes under the profile of the Treasurer and he should do it. The matter was deferred till the next meeting. The amount was thus not sanctioned.
