The associate professional

The subjects of Pathology and Microbiology are truly corporate subjects. Professional standards are not entirely dependant on the Pathologist or Microbiologist. Dependence on others is more common than independence. This is because samples are collected and processed not necessarily by the pathologist or the microbiologist. The interpretation and the quality of the result however is the independent responsibility if not the right of the qualified practitioners of the subjects. This brings us to the crossroad where we should ponder whether our clinical colleagues and technical staff who with us form the sides and angles of the diagnostic triangle [this is the short-form we are so familiar with] are trained and sufficiently familiar with our requirements.

Clinical training beginning with undergraduation is indeed standardized since several years. The theory of pathology and microbiology that is taught is adequate although there is room for improvement. However practical classes seem to have little relevance to preparing for interaction between colleagues who choose clinical medicine and those who practice pathology and microbiology. While microbiology training has shed its old coat several times and has now acquired some relevance the same cannot be said for pathology. Most of the tests of identification [such as those of slides] are training in pattern recognition and consequent improvement in observational skills. The hematology exercise and urinalysis does test other aspects of practical skills, but subsequent relevance [especially in urinalysis] is better than that for slides and spots. We hardly teach on the relevance of providing history for a clinico-pathological correlation. Clinical Pathology is forgotten and even the importance of overnight fasting for lipid profile may not be heard of till internship, much after the degree is obtained with flying colours! Thus routine teaching is concentrated to the understanding of the basis of disease often ignoring laboratory diagnosis. At the same time postgraduates, except for most super-specialists, are hardly exposed to laboratories that help them with their diagnosis. Visits are often limited to enquire the reason for the delay in a report, to find out why the sample was inadequate or insufficient, to gather details for publication or presentation of an interesting case or series, of course to point out a wrong diagnosis and sometimes to provide history [is it needed when the entire organ or tissue is in front of you?]! Therefore responsibility of training clinical colleagues in the practical aspects of pathology and microbiology rests with the clinicians themselves while appointed postgraduate teachers in the concerned subjects are paid for it! Perhaps a day may not be far of when pathologists and microbiologists would reciprocate and repay by teaching bed-side medicine and surgical skills in the same vein [true penance!]. However one must admit that the current system of learning is working to a fair and perhaps accepted extent. Is this desirable or should we change? Would it not be advisable to include pathologists and microbiologists to teach clinical students some aspects of our daily requirements and expectations from them? The same applies to nursing students. Certainly this would improve matters and reduce constant complaints and bickering about problems in obtaining a reasonable diagnosis.

The other arm of efficient hospital and clinical services in pathology and microbiology is the technical staff. Their role is undoubtedly important. However there does not appear to be a systematic accreditation and training programme. Adequate courses that encompass essential theoretical and practical training in the subjects are hardly available [except in few institutions]. By and large diploma in Medical Laboratory Technology, and graduates in science are the basic qualifications that are necessary for such posts nowadays. However experience indicates that varying periods of in-house training actually are necessary to improve their skills. Many would vouch that even those with primary or secondary schooling are as efficient provided they are trained sufficiently by the institution or the pathologist or microbiologist under whom they worked. Thus should pathologists and microbiologists in addition to qualified and experienced technologists themselves be actively involved in the formal training of medical technologists?

The role of the pathologist and the microbiologists in education is thus much wider than teaching undergraduates and postgraduates in pathology or microbiology. The service aspects of the subjects are uniquely bonded to other specialties and technical staff. While the possible means of training of medical staff and nursing staff can be understood and formulated, that of technical staff is complex unless the sane institution runs such courses. Since the training of technicians is not under the purview of the Medical Council, some form of accreditation may be necessary to maintain uniformity. For example in the case of radiation technologists / technicians, certification by the Atomic Energy and Radiation Board is essential. Cytotechnologists can obtain one through the Indian Academy of Cytology.

It is thus necessary for the Indian Association of Pathologists and Microbiologists to seriously contemplate on these issues to improve standards of the profession. Perhaps a separate Education Council / Committee within the association should take this responsibility. At least the ground must be prepared so that the association with its large pool of experienced members can suggest and reasonably advice appropriate boards for education and training.
